Program Overview

The Crispus Attucks Codorus STEAM Ambassadors Program (CACSAP) is a six-week interactive summer learning experience designed for students in grades 10th-rising college students. The program incorporates a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) framework to engage students in interdisciplinary learning through hands-on activities, career exploration, and real-world applications.

This program connects students, professionals, and community leaders through a blend of classroom-based instruction, field experiences, and project-based learning. 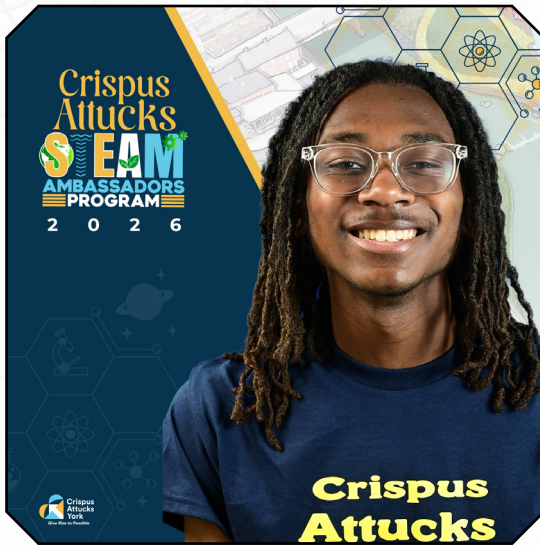

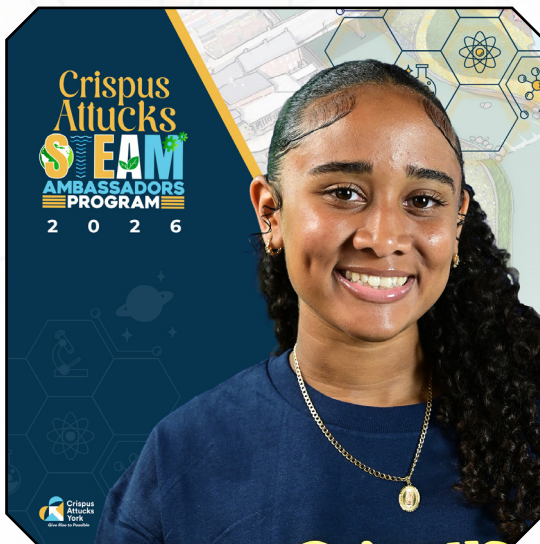
My most memorable moment was going to Pennsylvania American Water Company. It was interesting because I got to see how the water looks before it undergoes the cleaning process.

Most Memorable Moment

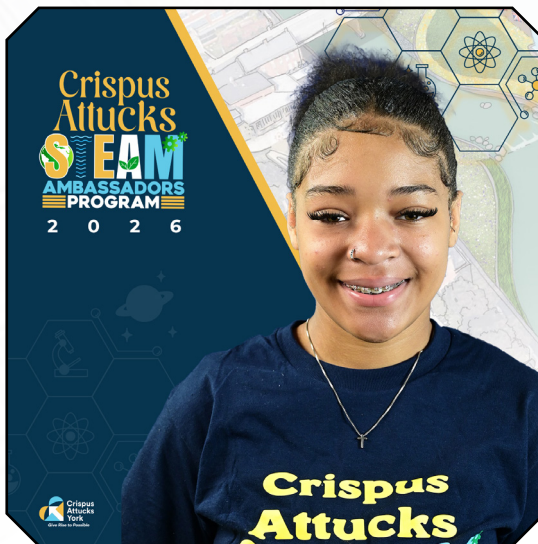
My favorite moment was when we went to the Byrnes Center and we did forensics. I really enjoyed testing blood samples and looking at different nerves and cells through the microscope.

Most Memorable Moment

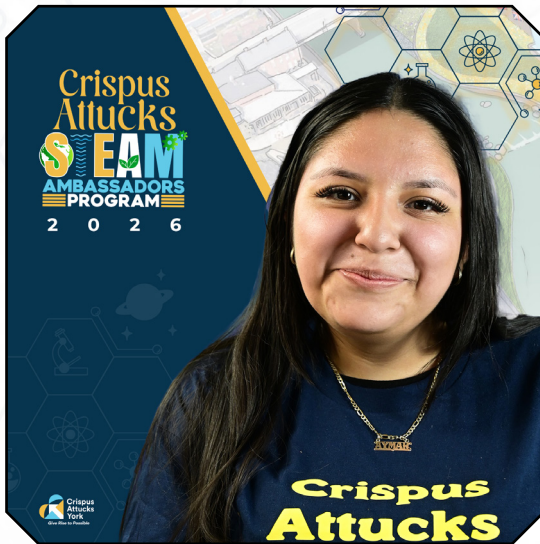
My most memorable moment was going to the escape room because I really enjoy going to things like that and figuring stuff out and as a group. It makes everything feel better and makes it easier.
